

They say imitation is the best form of flattery but plagiarism is not.
Misrepresenting the work of others as your own is theft, and will result in severe consequences.

Policy Framework

We are guided by

The Council of Community Colleges of Jamaica, provides strict guidelines on student academic conduct and capacity building. The policy framework and practices of TTPC also operate within the boundaries of these frames.

The CCCJ defines plagiarism as the "failure to properly acknowledge use of another person's work, or submitting for assessment, material that is not a student's own work"; and, "misrepresentation of a piece of group work as the student's individual work" (p.41).

The above will prompt the following process:

The CCCJ coordinator at TTPC will

- a. Advise the student of infraction
 - b. Prepare an incident report
- c. Lodge a report with the TTPC Academic Disciplinary Committee (p.42-43).

Get inside the framework; request a copy of the TTPC Plagiarism policy from the Office of Research & Planning or the Vice Principal-Academics

Ask about the TTPC plagiarism policy

The TTPC plagiarism policy categories of academic theft:

- 1. Unacknowledged quotes
 - 2. Miscitation
- 3. Unattributed borrowing
- 4. Cosmetic paraphrasing
- 5. Wrong attributed borrowing
 - 6. Collusion

Be in the know, get a copy of the CCCJ and TTPC policy. Ignorance is not a valid excuse.



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EXCERPTS FROM OUR TTPC POLICY ON PLAGIARISM....

TTPC's six (6) broad categories of plagiarism:

- Unacknowledged quotations this is the use of direct quotes, ideas, themes, graphs, diagrams, and theories without properly giving credit to the creator/author. Failure to give proper credit to spoken words is also a breach of proper citing and scholarly responsibilities.
- Miscitation this is the act of deceptively crediting others for a body of work or quotes. Authors and content creators must be accurately credited for their work, failure to do so violates ethical standards.
- Unattributed borrowing this is the failure to credit the author/creator when paraphrasing from their work. Proper credit must be provided even when direct quotes are not being utilized.
- 4. Cosmetic paraphrasing this breach occurs when an individual credits the author but the words used in the paraphrase are too close to the original quotes. Using synonyms to modify a direct quote is a violation of the institutional policy.
- Wrong attributed borrowing this breach occurs when an individual fails to acknowledge a body of work that has

inspired his/her own (through structure and idea), but utilizes quotes and diagrams from the original source. If you borrow methods, structure, and ideas to inform your paper; the original document must be acknowledged.

 Collusion – Your assignments should reflect independent study and exploration. If you present a modified/updated version of an assignment presented by a former or present student you have committed a breach.

The Trench Town Polytechnic College Academic Disciplinary Committee constitutes the following members:

- Vice Principal of Academics (Chairperson)
- Vice Principal of Administrative Affairs (Deputy Chairperson)
- Campus Registrar
- Head of Department (members in this capacity will reflect the leader of the unit of the course where the breach occurred).
- Librarian

The CCCJ and TTPC policies and practices on plagiarism, misconduct and structure are the framework that students must operate within.

Be reminded of your duty to yourself and the institution, always maintain a sound character.

The Library at TTPC remains committed to student development, and will provide the support needed.
